THE CLEVELAND CLINIC DEPLOYS IMASOFT VIEWER

Cleveland, Ohio, Tuesday June 1, 2004 – The Cleveland Clinic Foundation, one of the largest healthcare institutions in the country, announced today that it has chosen a Digital Radiology Viewer from Imasoft Inc. of Montreal, Canada, for deployment in its department of Pediatric Cardiology.

The Imasoft Digital Radiology Viewer is a PC application that lets physicians view any type of digital examination that conforms to the international DICOM standard (Digital Imaging and COmmunications in Medecine) used in cardiology, echography and nuclear medecine.

“Imasoft has efficiently provided software that meets our needs,” says Robert Cecil, Ph.D. Network director at The Cleveland Clinic Foundation. “Our need for a customized stand-alone DICOM viewer to support distribution of images on CD-ROM was met in under 30-days. Key criteria met by this viewer are its support of angiography and ultra-sound cine runs and a simplicity of operation which allows referring physicians to view images efficiently without further training.”

The Imasoft Viewer will be burned onto every CD-ROM distributed by the Department of Pediatric Cardiology at the Cleveland Clinic Foundation. “We perform thousands of examinations each year. Patients and their referring physician have a need to routinely review these exams,” added Dr. Cecil. “The Imasoft Viewer completely meets this need. A referring physician need only insert the CD-ROM into their computer and the exam’s images are automatically presented for his review. No installation or training is necessary and all DICOM image types are supported so that the patient’s physician can see all that we see.”

“This is a significant business development for Imasoft”, said Richard Blouin, 51, president and founder of the company. “The Cleveland Clinic Foundation is at the forefront of modern medecine, and a pioneer in Digital Radiology. We are honored that they chose us and we intend to serve them well”.
